



Covid Information

I am so very, very impressed with how responsive and respectful you have all been as you communicate with us about your covid situations in your households. The contact you have made either via phone, texts or face to face is to be commended.

Thank you for supporting your children with their learning from home when they have been well enough. Thank you also for helping your children look after their precious devices. They have been coming back to school in a good condition and this has meant they have been able to return to class quickly so they can be used in their classroom learning programme.

We continue as a country to be in the Red Setting which means we keep following the processes and protocols we have in place at our kura to support everyone from contracting covid. This means continuing to wear masks from Years 4 upwards, washing and drying hands well, and sanitising hands and equipment regularly. We are able to gather together inside our environment/hall up to 200 people (however there needs to be a meter between each person which still limits us at this stage). We can now gather outside with unlimited people (but still with 1 meter between each person). We look forward to seeing the Red Setting change to Orange and then to Green.
