A tip from the Public Health Nurse for dealing with HEADLICE

Wet Combing:

Wet combing on its own can be effective for removing headlice and their eggs. Eggs are cemented strongly to the hair shaft and simple washing does not remove that. Metal combs are much more effective than plastic combs. Using a 'nit' comb is easiest when the hair is wet. Combing may be easier if a conditioner is applied first. It is best done after treating with medication. You need to have good light.

If you are using conditioner wet the hair with water and then massage the conditioner through the hair to make combing easier.

Work through the hair in sections and comb down the hair shaft towards the scalp to try to remove the stubborn eggs. It may be easier if this is done while the child is kept occupied (for example watching television).

Wet comb the hair for at least 30 minutes. This needs to be done every 3 or 4 days, for at least two weeks, but don't stop combing every 3 or 4 days until there have been no live lice on 3 consecutive sessions.

In summary: wet comb for 30 minutes – 3-4 day intervals – at least 2 weeks – until no lice on 3 consecutive sessions (3 combing sessions in a row).

RECIPE MAKEOVERS

Imagination and experimentation are all part of the fun when it comes to recipe makeovers.

Here are some tips to help you put a healthy spin on your favourite recipes.



- Add more vegetables.
- Swap refined bread, rice, pasta and noodles for whole grain or wholemeal varieties.
- Use lean meat or poultry, or remove the visible fat or skin.
- Add legumes like beans, chickpeas or lentils to bulk out meals.
- Swap full-fat milk products with low or reduced-fat options.
- Use herbs and spices instead of salt to add flavour.
- Choose salt-reduced sauces and stocks.
- Use plant-based, unsaturated fats for cooking, like olive oil.
- Boil, steam, stir-fry and bake food rather than frying or deep-frying.
