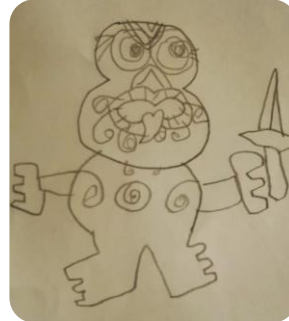

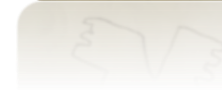
Food Bank 6th Annual Food Drive
